<p>Capital Financing - Recent Developments</p> <p>Rick Manoloff, Partner, Squire Patton Boggs LLP, Michael Armagno, Senior Associate, PNC Capital Markets LLC</p>	<p>This course will cover an overview of recent developments that impact how public school districts can borrow in today's market. Some topics that will be discussed include the impact of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act on municipal finance, recent federal security regulation changes, state level legislation and policy developments, and tax levy law updates.</p> <p>This workshop provides a concise summary of recent changes that impact how Ohio school districts borrow to finance school facilities and to refinance existing debt. Understanding the process of issuing bonds is very important for every school business official. There have been quite a few recent developments that impact how debt is issued.</p>
<p>Grants Management</p> <p>Brian Jones, Executive Director, Office of School Finance, Ohio Department of Education</p>	<p>This session will discuss the various aspects of the grants management process at both the state and district levels. This discussion will include navigating and working in ODE's e-grant system (CCIP), address any future updates, identify uniform guidance sections of interest (such as policy and procedures and internal controls) and compliance monitoring results.</p> <p>Managing grants is an important facet of the operation of a district. However, training on specific requirements and use of the CCIP are limited. This session is geared to provide treasurers with the needed information to ensure they manage grants effectively and efficiently all the while ensuring they stay within federal compliance.</p>
<p>Investment Update for Ohio's School Districts</p> <p>Jason Headings, Vice President Public Funds, Meeder Investment Management</p>	<p>This course will provide an overview of various investment vehicles available to public school districts. This will give school business officials the information they need to help make informed decisions with how to invest funds, including the pros and cons of the various investment types.</p> <p>This course will provide attendees with an overview of a variety of methods for investing excess funds. There are specific investments permitted by Ohio law allowed for school districts. Understanding the various investment types available to school districts is critical for school treasurers.</p>
